As the year comes to an end, the fourth grade students are continuing to work hard. We are finishing up our Response to Literature writing unit. For this writing unit, the children are writing a Book Review on the book Going Home by Eve Bunting. In Math we are working on lessons that will help the students prepare for fifth grade. The students are also taking the New York State Science Exam which is a two part exam. The first is the hands on part where students use science materials to conduct experiments which they have to write about. The second part consists of multiple choice questions which tests the students knowledge of the science curriculum.

The fourth grade was fortunate to participate in Studio in a School this year. We have worked on many different art projects throughout the school year. We completed our clay project where the students had the opportunity to make a replica of their head using clay. Our fabulous art work was displayed in the Studio in the School Art Show in June. We also had the opportunity to go on a fantastic trip to the Queens Zoo this year. We were able to spend the day at the zoo and observe many animals in their natural habitat. Children were not only able to see the animals, but also able to touch them. We had an amazing time! Another exciting day at P.S. 99 was Take Your Child To Work Day. Many teachers, staff and administrators brought their own children into school. The students loved meeting them! This has been a great year for the fourth grade. Fifth Grade by Ms. Merino

This year 5th grade enrichment students had the opportunity to work with Karen and Ms. Merino. We started our motivation around cyber bullying and asked how certain images and words that are posted online may hurt and affect others. Students brainstormed the importance of the idea to "think before you send", encouraging students to think about what they may want to post before they hit the send button. From there we transitioned students to discuss peacemakers around the world. As their final project, students chose one peace maker to create a photomontage to represent everything important about their chosen peacemaker.

In reading, students were engaged in a high-interest topic; natural disasters, with a literacy focus on point of view in literature, research, and opinion writing. The topic integrates science content with a Social Studies focus on the Western Hemisphere and the role of multinational organizations. Students read about the science behind natural disasters, specifically earthquakes and hurricanes. Then we read two pieces of literature that are set during a natural disaster: Eight Days: A Story of Haiti and the novel Dark Water Rising. Students analyze how the narrator's perspective determines how events are described and analyze visual elements and compare and contrast themes in these two texts.

In writing, students worked on a research-based argument essay, trying to convince readers that zoos either help or harm endangered animals. Together we watched a video, read an article written by two students, and studied a "Life Span of Female African Elephants' chart. Based on what they know, students were asked to state a claim and back it up with evidence from their research to support their claim in order to make their essay more convincing to readers!

Students have received their placement schools and are now preparing for next year as some stay in 99 and others to different middle schools.

Sixth Grade by Mr. Condon

This year's 6th graders have done so many exciting things. Besides getting ready for graduation, prom and other senior activities, there are many 6th graders participating in this year's school play, *The Lion King*. We were excited to see the final performance and various students perform their talents for the entire school to enjoy.

During the school year, we read several novels that we thoroughly analyzed and enjoyed including; The *Lightning Thief; Bud, Not Buddy; Dragon Wings and Frightful's Mountain.* In an effort to increase our exposure and appreciation of the arts, we enjoyed two trips to the ballet. The first trip was to the Frank Sinatra Performing Arts High School in Astoria, which showed us how dancers prepared for a performance. We also saw an actual performance. The second trip was to the American Ballet Theatre.

We were excited to end the year with our senior trip to Medieval Times and our school picnic. We look forward to our summer and our new journey to middle school to continue our academic careers.
